METHOD OF RECKONING FOR THE TORAH CALENDAR

THE DAY BEGINS AT DUSK

Genesis 1:5. Elohim called the light Day, and the darkness He called Night. And there came to be evening and there came to be morning the first day.

Leviticus 23:32. [The moedim are] sabbath[s] of rest to you...from evening to evening you observe [My] sabbath[s].

Deuteronomy 16:6 ...At the place where אֱלֹהִים Elohim chooses to make His Name dwell...in the evening, at the going down of the sun, at the appointed time (moedim)...

H#6153-ereb: "dusk, through the idea of covering with a texture, thus to grow dusky at sundown."

SEVEN-DAY WEEK

Genesis 1:31-2:3. And there came to be evening and there came to be morning the sixth day...[and Elohim]...rested on the seventh day from all the work which He had made, and...blessed the seventh day and set it apart.

H#7620-shabuwa: "to be complete, thus a complete week of seven days."

A LUNAR / SOLAR SYSTEM

Job 3:6 - That night - let darkness seize it. Let it not be included among the days of the year (shaneh-solar cycle), nor let it not come into the number of the moons/months (yerach).

Genesis 1:14. And Elohim said, Let lights come to be in the expanse of

the heavens to separate the day from the night, and let them be for signs ('owth) and appointed times (moedim), and for days and years.

H#226-'owth: to come or assent in the sense of appearing, a signal...beacon...evidence (Strong's Concordance)

Psalm 104:19 He made the moon (yereach) for appointed times (moedim); the sun knows its entrance (mabo, H3996)."

Lev. 23:4 "These are the appointed times [moedim] of אֲפֻדָּי, set apart gatherings which you are to proclaim at their appointed times [moedim].

H#4150-moed: An appointment, a fixed time or season; specifically a festival; conventionally a year (Strong's) From #H3259, ya'ad, meaning "to fix upon (by agreement/appointment) by impl. to meet at a specific time (Gesenius Lexicon)

VISIBLE LUNAR CRESCENT

Sirach 43:6-8. It is the moon (yerach) which marks the changing seasons, governing the times, their everlasting sign. From the moon comes the sign for moedim, a light which wanes when it completes its course (teshuwbah). The new moon (chodesh), as its name suggests, renews itself; how marvelous it is in this change, a beacon to the hosts on high, shining in the vault of heaven.

H#3391-yerach: to be yellow, indicating a reflection of light. (Gesenius' Lexicon) moon or lunar month. (Strong's Lexicon)

H#2320-chodesh: new moon, by impl., a month. From H#2318 "chadash", "to renew or cause to rebuild" (Strongs), or "to polish a sword [shape of the first crescent]" (Gesenius' Lexicon)

THE YEAR BEGINS IN SPRING

2Sam 11:1. It came to be at the

teshuwbah hayah shaneh, at the time sovereigns go out to battle, that David sent Yo'ab and his servants with him, and all Yisrael.

1Chr 20:1 And it came to be at the teshubah hayah shaneh, at the time sovereigns go out to battle, that Yo'ab led out the power of the army...

Teshubah hayah shaneh - turn of the year, spring of the year, or after the year was expired; teshubah (H8666) is from H7725 shub, "a recurrence of time or place" and is used '5 times in reference to the spring as the "turn" of the year' [2Sam 11:1; 1Ki 20:22,26; 1Chr 20:1; 2Chr 36:10]. (TWOT item 2340f)

"After the year was expired (KJV rendering) is literally "at the return of the year"; that is, in the Spring...the time of year for the commencement or renewal of military movements, the season of severe storms being over, and the ground starting to dry after the winter snow and rains". (Manners and Customs Of the Bible). The Gregorian month which coincides approximately with the beginning of the Scriptural year is sequentially known as "March", named after "mars, the false-elohim of war".

Exodus 34:22 And perform the... Festival of Ingathering at the tequwphah hayah shaneh
2 Chr. 24:23 And it came to be, at the tequwphah hayah shaneh, that the army of Aram came up against him...

Psalm 19:6 [The sun's] rising is from one end of the heavens, and its tequwphah to the other end; and naught is hidden from its heat.

Tequwphah hayah shaneh - translated "the turn of the year, circuit, or year's end", and from H5362-naqap, meaning "a revolution (of the sun), course (of

time), yearly cycle".

Heading 6 months backward in time from the autumn equinox at Sukkot, we arrive at the vernal equinox at the time of Pesach, indicating that "teshuwbah" and "tequwphah" are the Scriptural terms used to reference the equinoxes (solar signs dividing the Scriptural seasons of summer/seedtime and winter/harvest).

Exodus 12:2. This month [chodesh] is the beginning of months for you, it is the first month of the year.

AGRICULTURE INDICATIONS

Deuteronomy 16:1, Observe (shamar) the month (chodesh) of Abib, and perform the Passover to אֱלֹהִים your Elohim, for in the month of Abib אֱלֹהִים your Elohim brought you out of Egypt by night.

H#8104-shamar: To protect, guard, take heed, mark, watch, or observe (i.e. evidence seen by the eyes [cf. *Psa 130:6a*])

"Abib: The original name of the first lunar month of the [Hebrew] calendar...understood to mean "ripening grain" or "green ears," and it was during this month that the barley harvest took place, followed some weeks later by the wheat harvest." (Gesenius)

Fresh, young ears [heads of grain], also...name for the first month of the [Hebrew] calendar (New American Standard Concordance)

"To be tender, green, ie. a young ear of grain, hence the name of the month Abib...the first month of the [Hebrew] calendar equal to Nisan (March-April); head (of grain), already ripe, but still soft (Strongs H#0024)

"This noun refers to barley that is already ripe, but still soft, the grains of which are eaten either rubbed or roasted... According to Lev 2:14 the grain offering [of

firstfruits] was to consist of the firstfruits of abib." (TWOT)

OBSERVATION LOCATION

Do not offer your offerings in every place that you see, except in the place which אֱלֹהִים chooses among your tribes, there you are to offer your offerings and there you are to do all that I command you. (Deut. 12:13,14) For where two or three assemble together in My Name, I am there in the midst of them.

(Matt18:20) Do you not know that you are a dwelling place of Elohim, and that the Spirit of Elohim dwells in you?...For the dwelling place of Elohim is set-apart, which you are.

(1Cor 3:16,17) Believe me, the hour is coming when you shall neither on this mountain, nor in Yahrushalem worship the Father... but the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth, for the Father does also seek such to worship him. John 4:21,23

While the decision ultimately, and for reasons of conscience, rests on the individual, this calendar is by way of explanation based on the predicted U.S. sightings of the visible crescents, and the species of wild barley originally occurring and defined as "abib" in Israel. Expected dates for sighting of the visible crescent are obtained from multiple sources, including the U.S. Naval Observatory, Almanac, and MoonCalc 6.0.

Notations are made, however, wherever the predicted new moon sighting is uncertain, or where the U.S. sighting will differ from that in Israel. "Prove all things" as you observe and adjust the actual dates of the Feasts as necessary, according to conviction and conscience. May אֱלֹהִים bless you in keeping the

Important Note On **אביב**'s Death, Resurrection and the Wave Sheaf: According to Tanakh, the first-fruit barley is always waved on the "morrow after the weekly Shabbat" which falls during the Passover feast. Thus while Abib 14 / Passover day rotates throughout the week from year to year, the Wave Sheaf, and Shavuot/Pentecost (counted 50 days thereafter) invariably falls on the first day of the week. The year of **אביב**'s death and resurrection, Abib 14 fell on a Wednesday, on which afternoon **אביב** died. Three full days and nights then brings us to dusk as Shabbat is waning towards the first of the week, and it was at this dusk hour that **אביב** was raised from the dead, and subsequently appeared to Miriam of Magdala the following morning during Bikurim as the Barley Wave Sheaf was taking place on the first day of the week.

Known in Greek as “Pentecost”, meaning “50”, which is the total number of days counted from the Passover Wave Sheaf to the first-fruits of wheat harvest which are offered to קָרָבָן at Shavuot. The 8 days are traditionally pictured in the 8 branches of a special 8-branch “Chanukkah Menorah”, which are lit in turn by a center “shamash” or elevated servant candle (picturing וְחִנּוּכָהּ). Also known as the “Festival of Lights”, there are significant Messianic considerations for observance, including the historical reality of וְחִנּוּכָהּ ’s presence in the Temple (Jn 10:23), conception as the “Light of Israel” (Isa 10:17, Lk 2:32) and “Temple made without human hands” (Mk 14:58) during this Feast. Subsequently, Chanukkah tells the story of Yisrael’s dire need of rededication (or in Hebrew, ‘chanukkah’) to Him!
